| Addington Showgrounds & Race Course | Established during WW11 as an accommodation and training camp | |
| Ashburton Race Course and Showgrounds | Established during WW11 as an accommodation and training camp | |
| Ardmore | Established in WW11 as a Detention Barracks with cells for 30 prisoners under sentence and 20 guards | |
| Avondale, Auckland | A NZ Reinforcement Camp used during WW1 and further expanded in 1942 as a holding camp for both Army and Navy and became a holding camp for Prisoners of War | |
| Awapuni, Palmerston North | A NZ Reinforcement Camp used during WW1 and used during WW11 as troop accommodation | |
| Belton Park | A WW1 NZEF training camp for machine gun specialist training | Also known as Grantham |
| Booth's Farm, Carterton | Established during WW11 for the 2 nd Wellington Regiment | |
| Borthwicks, Tauherenikau | Established during WW11 for the 12 th Field Regiment and the 23 rd AT(Anti-Tank) Battery | |
| Boscombe | A WW1 NZEF training camp for engineer specialist training and the training camp for the Maori Pioneer Battalion, located in Bournemouth | |
| Brighton | A WW1 NZEF Convalescent Home for officers and NZ Army Nursing sisters | |
| Brockenhurst Hospital | A WW1 NZEF hospital, first known as the No 2 Stationary Hospital (in May 1916) and then was designated as the No1 New Zealand General Hospital | 1,600 patient capacity. Over 20,000 soldiers admitted to this hospital during the War |
| Brocton | A WW1 NZEF Reserves Depot located in Staffordshire | Also the base depot for the NZ Rifle Brigade |
| Burnham | A mobilization base established for 2 NZEF troops from the South Island | |
| Carterton Showgrounds | Established during WW11 for the 7 th Brigade Headquarters | |

| Codford | A WW1 NZ Depot for NZ soldiers between convalescence and fitness. Also the location for the No3 New Zealand General Hospital | Located on the Salisbury Plains |
| Dannevirke Showground | Established in 1940 as a Battalion camp for training and later converted to a district School of Instruction | |
| Donald's Farm, Tauerenikau | Established during WW11 as a Motor Transport Park | |
| Delta | Located west of Blenheim. Established in 1941 for the advanced training of Territorial force personnel | |
| Etaples | The WW1 NZ Overseas Base Camp in France | This was a training camp to prepare the men for the Front Line |
| Ewshot | A WW1 NZEF training camp for artillery and Medical Corps specialist training. Located in Hampshire | |
| Featherson, Wairarapa | A NZ Reinforcement Camp used during WW1 and during WW11 it became the base for the Queen Alexandra's Mounted Regiment, the 5 th Reserve Motor Transport Company and a Prisoner of War Camp for Japanese prisoners | |
| Flat Point | Established during WW11 as a Coast Watching Station | Located on the West Coast between Castle Point and Cape Palliser |
| Foxton Race Course | Established in 1940 as troop accommodation | |
| Grantham | A WW1 NZEF training camp for machine gun specialist training | Also known as Belton Park |
| Great Barrier Island | Established in 1942 as a Fortress camp and as a Coast Watching Station | |

| Harewood, Christchurch | Established in 1942 as an armoured fighting vehicle camp | |
| Helwan Camp, Cairo | A subsidiary 2NZEF Base Camp in the Middle East | |
| Hitchin | A WW1 NZEF training camp for the specialist training of signallers, located northeast of Luton near Stevenage in Hertfordshire. | |
| Hopuhopu, Ngaruawahia | Established in 1927 for Territorial force training and then developed into a mobilization camp for volunteers of the 2 NZEF | |
| Hornchurch | First established, in Jan 1916, as the original WW1 New Zealand General Depot for all NZ troops and in 1916 became the NZ Convalescent Hospital, commonly known as the Hornchurch Convalescent Hospital. | Located 30km from London |
| Hororata Race Course | Established during WW11 as an accommodation and training camp | |
| Johnsonville, Wellington | Established in 1942 as a canvas camp | |
| Kaikohē | Established in 1942 to accommodate a Brigade (12 th Brigade) | |
| Khandallah, Wellington | Established in 1942 as a Fortress camp | |
| Kensington Park, Whangarei | Established in 1940 as an accommodation camp | |
| Lancaster Park, Christchurch | Established during WW11 as an accommodation and training camp | |
| Linton | Established in 1941 as a permanent Territorial Force training camp | |
| Maadi Camp, Cairo | The WW2 2NZEF Base Camp in the Middle East | |
| Masterton Memorial Park | Established during WW11 for the 8 th Field Ambulance and the 1 st Hawke's Bay Guards on Vital Points | |
| Maymorn, Wellington | A Temporary Subsidiary Camp used during WW1 | |

| Opuia | Established in 1942 as a Fortress camp | |
| Paihia | Established in 1942 as a Fortress camp | |
| Palmerston North Showgrounds | Established during WW11 as an accommodation and training camp | Occupied by the 28 th Maori Battalion |
| Papakura | Established in 1939 as a mobilization base | |
| Papawai, Wairarapa | A NZ Reinforcement Camp used during WW1 | |
| Porirua | Established in 1942 as a training camp for the 3 rd Wellington Battalion | |
| Pukekohe | Established in 1942 as a Brigade camp and was part of the defence of Auckland | |
| Rakaia Domain | Established during WW11 as an accommodation and training camp | |
| Rangiora Race Course | Established during WW11 as an accommodation and training camp | |
| Rangioutu, Wellington | A Temporary Subsidiary Camp used during WW1 | |
| Rayner's Farm, Mount Bruce | Established during WW11 for the 5 th ASC | |

| Sling | A WW1 NZEF Base Camp in the UK. Located on the Salisbury Plains | The camp where NZ soldiers were prepared for moving to the front lines in France and Belgium. Training took 30 days. |
| Solway Showgrounds, Masterton | Established during WW11 as a camp for the 1 st Ruahine | |
| Spriggin's Park, Whanganui | Established in 1940 for soldier accommodation and training | |
| Tauherenikau Race Course | A Temporary Subsidiary Camp used during WW1 and during WW11 became the base for the 1 st Scottish | |
| Tauranga Race Course | Established in 1942 as an accommodation camp | |
| Timaru Showgrounds | Established during WW11 as an accommodation and training camp | |
| Torquay | A WW1 NZ Evacuation Depot located in Devon | |
| Trentham, Upper Hutt | A NZ Reinforcement Camp used during WW1 and during WW11 it became an Ordnance Depot; the Army School of Instruction and a training base for 2 NZEF | Still a military base |
| Waikanae, Kapiti Coast | A Temporary Subsidiary Camp used during WW1 | |
| Waiouru | Established in 1939 as a permanent training camp | |
| Wairoa | Established at Lambton Square in 1942 as a Company base | |
| Waitangi | Established in 1942 as a Fortress camp | |
| Waiwera | Located SW of Dunedin. Established in 1942 as a training camp for up to | |

| Wanganui Race Course | Established in 1940 for soldier accommodation and training | |
| Warkworth | Established in 1942 as a Brigade camp and was part of the defence of Auckland | |
| Washdyke Race Course | Established during WW11 as an accommodation and training camp | |
| Waverly Race Course | Established in 1940 for soldier accommodation and training | |
| Weedon's Domain | Established during WW11 as an accommodation and training camp | |
| Westerfield, Ashburton | Established in 1942 for the 10 th Brigade Group | |
| Whangarei | Established in 1942 to accommodate a Brigade (1 st Brigade) | |
| Wingatui, Dunedin | Established in 1940 as a Territorial Force training camp | |
